

Unexpected Sources of Poison Ivy / Oak Rash



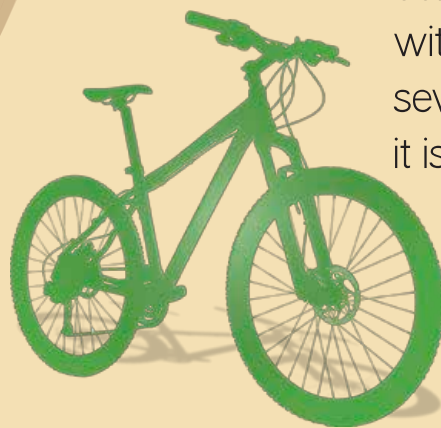
When in contact with poison ivy or oak plants, urushiol can stay on clothing until it is washed off.



Poison ivy and oak rash is caused by your skin's reaction to the plant's oil, called urushiol, which is found in all parts of the plant whether it is dead or alive.



Pets can carry urushiol on their fur and easily transfer it to you without you knowing it.



Urushiol can stay on equipment that has come in contact with the plants for several years unless it is washed off.



Urushiol can stay on gardening tools for a very long time and transfer the oil back to you.
